Emergency Department

What is an Emergency?

An emergency is a potentially life or limb threatening situation e.g.

- ~ Difficulty breathing
- ~ Heavy bleeding
- ~ Suspected heart attack
- ~ Unconsciousness
- ~ Severely broken bones

Wairau Emergency Department

- ~ Serves a catchment of 44,000 people
- ~ Sees approximately 18,000 patients per annum
- ~ Sees patients with serious injury or illness as a priority
- ~ Sees patients referred by General Practitioners (After Hours GP Service via Gate 2 - Hospital Rd)
- ~ Is open 24hours a day, 7 days a week

On Arrival

- ~ Please report to the Triage Nurse.
- ~ Your condition will be assessed.
- ~ You will be allocated a triage (waiting time) category. This is used to prioritise your treatment.
- ~ A receptionist will take your personal details.
- ~ You will be asked to wait in the waiting room if your condition is not serious.

Minor Injury or Illness

“Save the Emergency Department for Emergencies!”

If you have a minor injury or illness you will be advised to attend your GP if your illness/injury does not require Emergency Department treatment.

By using emergency services for minor problems you may prevent others from receiving urgent care.

Patients with minor injury or illness will be seen only when people in more urgent categories have been attended to.

Emergency Department staff are happy to advise and assist you in accessing local GP services.

Triage (waiting times) Categories

1 ~ Resuscitation

Life-threatening
e.g. cardiac arrest.
Seen immediately.

2 ~ Emergency

Potentially life-threatening
e.g. severe chest pain.
Seen within 10 minutes.

3 ~ Urgent

e.g. moderate asthma, some fractures
Generally seen within 30 minutes.

4 ~ Semi-Urgent

e.g. minor trauma, certain abdominal pain.
Generally seen within 1 hour (unless more urgent patients are waiting).

5 ~ Non-Urgent

e.g. cuts, abrasions, dressings.
Generally seen within 2 hours (unless more urgent patients are waiting).
