New initiative to help prevent falls



At Nelson Marlborough Health we strive to continually improve patient safety. Preventing falls is a long-running focus, which has been strengthened by the introduction of a new acute falls sticker system.

A sticker is placed in a patient's clinical notes when they've had a fall in hospital. The stickers give a visible record of a fall and precautions are put in place to their safety and wellbeing.

The acute falls sticker system is designed to aid communication, improve clinical documentation and meet patient safety requirements.
