PRIMHD seclusion report


This report summarises seclusion information submitted by Nelson Marlborough DHB into the Programme for the Integration of Mental Health Data (PRIMHD). The data was extracted from PRIMHD by the Ministry of Health on 6 July 2017 and analysed by Te Pou o te Whakaaro Nui. The report contains data to the year ending March 2017. Note this only presents the data that is in PRIMHD.

This report focus on non-forensic¹ people who are aged 18 to 64 years who are using inpatient services at any point in time during the period. Admission is the term used throughout this document. It means that it is a referral that is open at any point during the period. If a person experiences seclusion during a referral, within the period, the referral is recorded as experiencing seclusion.





Time spent in seclusion


Graph 4. Average number of hours spent in seclusion by people secluded during an admission, Nelson Marlborough DHB and all DHBs, April 2014 - March 2017





Notes: Percentage of collections in the clinical range (2, 3 or 4) for each HoNOS items. If the bars don't overlap then there is a significant difference between people secluded and not secluded in symptom/functioning.
