#### PSA and the CPS Sector

The CPS sector covers members working in a wide range of community-based organisations, such as disability, home support, mental health & addiction, and social services.

We continue to work on improving conditions and opportunities in what is often underfunded, insecure work, and a low paid, mainly female workforce. As New Zealand's largest union we have a strong voice when talking with both government and employers about our priorities such as equal pay, secure work, and career development opportunities.

The PSA is proud to have successfully lobbied for many recent developments, including:

- Winning guaranteed hours for home support workers
- Settlement of the 'in between travel case', ensuring home and community support workers are paid for the time spent traveling between clients houses
- Winning a ground-breaking equal pay settlement for care and support workers
- Successfully extending the equal pay settlement to cover mental health and addiction support workers

These achievements were only possible thanks to the collective efforts of our union members, delegates, and organisers.
