SECTION 2: MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING AND CORRESPONDENCE

2.1 Minutes of Previous Meeting Noted.

SECTION 3: ACTION POINTS

Item 1 – Medications Discussion Topic: Date still to be confirmed as we are waiting on information from PHARMAC.

Item 2 – Mental Health Triaging Data into Dashboard: Will incorporate the primary care view as much as we can, however note the primary care data is not an indication of unmet demand, but more the fact we have funding available in primary care (GPs are given an allocation of "packages" they can allocate to patients). The data is an indication of allocations GPs can give to patients. Still to do some work on the demand in primary care. Item completed.

Item 3 – Dental Amalgam paper from Waikato DHB: Have not been able to source the paper as they have had a change of staff and Board. Ongoing.

Item 4 – Readmission within 28 days of discharge: Noted we are one of the top performing DHBs for low readmission rates within 28 days. Queried with discharge for elderly whether we could discharge to rest homes rather than home to further reduce readmissions. Noted our length of stay is also low compared to other DHBs. Need to keep watching this space as we run at a high occupancy rate which can increase the risk of readmission. Item Completed.

Item 5 – Oral Health for Elderly: Due July

SECTION 4: GM REPORT

The Clinical Services report and dashboard were discussed.

Noted Wairau Hospital has had an increase in demand for beds, resulting in the establishment of a hospital flow initiative to alleviate pressure and bed blocks.

Noted the number of acutes in Nelson is having an impact on electives throughput, and we are revisiting having specific acute theatres.

Discussion held on staff workloads, scheduling, industrial action, and staff morale. It was acknowledged that staff are tired, and we are looking at a number of initiatives to change the way we currently do things. Noted MAPU comes on stream next month, initially running Monday to Friday. This will alleviate some pressure, however it will not be the answer to all issues.

SECTION 5: PRESENTATION – MENTAL HEALTH

Craig Fenwick (Clinical Director, Mental Health) and Joe Babinski (Child Psychiatrist, CAMHS) attended via VC for this item

Presentation given by GM Mental Health Addictions & DSS and Sarah Thompson (Sector Relationships & Contracts Manager – Mental Health Addictions & DSS) on the Government Inquiry into Mental Health and Addictions (Oranga Tāngata, Oranga Whānau).

Key themes of the Inquiry were:

- Expand access and choice
- Transform primary health care
- Strengthen the NGO sector
- Take a whole-of-government approach to wellbeing
- Facilitate mental health promotion and prevention
- Place people at the centre
- Take strong action on alcohol and other drugs
- Partner with families and whanau
- Prevent suicide
- Reform the Mental Health Act
- Establish a new Mental Health and Wellbeing Commission
- Refer to the Health and Disability Sector Review
- Establish a cross-party working group on mental health and wellbeing.

Forty recommendations were made, of which 19 were accepted, 15 were accepted in principle, four need further consideration, and two were rejected.

Recommendations most relevant for DHBs were:

Recommendation 1 (accepted)

Significantly increase funded access to MH&A for mild to moderate and moderate to severe needs.

<u>Recommendation 2</u> (accepted in principle) New target for access: 3% to 20%.

<u>Recommendation 3</u> (accepted in principle) MOH and Mental Health & Wellbeing Commission to report on a new target.

Recommendation 4 (accepted)

Access should be based on need (not age, ethnicity or income).

Recommendation 5 (accepted)

Broaden services available, increasing choice.

Recommendation 7 (accepted)

Strategy for cross-government investment for MH&A services.

<u>Recommendation 10</u> (accepted in principle) Review and establish funding rules and expectations.

<u>Recommendation 12</u> (accepted) Staged funding path for access, options, service design.

<u>Recommendation 14</u> (accepted in principle) Future strategies primary health care sector to have explicit MH&A focus.

<u>Recommendation 15</u> (accepted in principle)

Identify lead agency to improve commissioning of health and social services with NGOs.

<u>Recommendation 20</u> (accepted in principle) DHBs to report on how we involve people with lived experience in governance, planning, policy and service development.

<u>Recommendation 23</u> (accepted) MOH to lead development of guidance on sharing info/partnering with families and whānau.

Recommendation 24 (accepted)

To be integrated into training across MH&A workforce, all relevant contracts, quality improvement processes etc.

<u>Recommendation 27</u> (further consideration needed) Replace criminal sanctions with civil responses for personal use of controlled drugs.

Recommendation 33 (accepted)

Ministry of Justice and MOH to review processes for suicide investigations.

Recommendation 34 (accepted)

Repeal and replace Mental Health (Compulsory Assessment and Treatment) Act 1992. Noted current Act is old and does need changing, however it will be challenging to get the balance right.

<u>Recommendation 36</u> (accepted) New Mental Health and Wellbeing Commission.

The two recommendations rejected were: <u>Recommendation 31</u> – Government says "no" to suicide reduction target.

<u>Recommendation 17</u> – The State Services Commission to report on options for a locus of responsibility for social wellbeing.

The other recommendations were noted.

Budget 2019

DHB level information supporting Budget 2019 is not yet available which limits, but does not prevent, current conversations about funding, implementation timeframes and strategies.

Workforce development is essential. While the government is leading this, we will also need to think and act locally.

Discussion held on the recommendation to include alcohol into the addictions space as more harm is caused by alcohol than drugs.

Discussion held on the importance of keeping healthy – with a more holistic approach. In psychiatry more and more discussion is highlighted on the importance of nutrition. Mental Health teams link closely with dietitians, especially CAMHS. This also includes the social economic levels of our community, looking at how lifestyle issues reflect on illness. Need to be the ambulance at the top of the cliff rather than at the bottom. Agreed investment is needed for initiative like the First 1000 Days, early identification of issues and wrapping services around people.

Discussion held on reducing suicide rates. Noted suicide is a significant issue in NZ and we do need to do better, but the answer does not lie only in secondary mental health services – the answer lies in connections and having people alongside to understand the suffering a person is going through.





4.3 Ministry of Transport Drug Driving

The Government is considering making changes to New Zealand's drug driver testing and enforcement regime. Research shows that many illicit and prescription drugs have the potential to impair driving, and studies show that New Zealanders are using those drugs and driving. Addressing drug impaired driving is an important objective if we are to make our roads safer - since 2013, the number of road deaths in New Zealand has increased by nearly 50 percent. Drug driving is making an increasing contribution to this statistic. The consultation seeks feedback about:

- How we can be better at detecting drug drivers and deterring drug driving? •
- The circumstances in which drivers should be tested for drugs? •
- How to decide which drugs to test for? •
- What evidence is required to establish a drug driving offence? •
- How we should deal with people caught drug driving?

Our Submission

The consultation is focused on increasing the use of oral tests for road side testing. Many institutes have concerns about the oral testing because it is considered unreliable and inconsistent. This submission requests that oral tests are not used for random road side testing because the tests can be inaccurate. We recommend that the current Compulsory Impairment Test is contained to be used. This submission highlights the importance of additional funding to manage addictions, and any penalties for drug driving need to be coupled with treatment for drug use (which would need further resourcing). In addition, further public awareness campaigns need to be undertaken that highlight drug driving including driving under the influence of medications.

4.4 Ministry for Primary Industries Review of the Walking Access Act 2008

The Walking Access Act 2008 (the Act) is about providing free access to the outdoors for walking and for types of access that may be associated with walking, such as access with firearms, dogs, bicycles, or motor vehicles.

Our Submission

The submission is supportive of the Act. We note that whilst access to nature is important, it must be carefully managed to ensure that the environment is not degraded. Environmental protection should be a key priority.
