### Response to a request for official information

Dear

Thank you for your request for official information as a partial transfer of Parts 4 & 5 (of 5) from the Ministry of Health and received 8 May 2020 by Nelson Marlborough Health (NMH)<sup>1</sup>, where you seek information on Covid-19 hospitalisation and mortality.

As advised 14 May 2020, the DHB does not collect data on 'lived experience of disability', however we are able to report on Covid-19 (positive cases) hospitalisation and mortality by Maori and Non-Maori from 30 January to 30 April 2020.

# This request relates to the period 30 January 2020 (when Covid-19 became a public health emergency of international concern) and 30 April 2020.
