Response to a request for official information

Dear

Thank you for your request for official information received 31 March 2020 by Nelson Marlborough Health (NMH)¹, followed by the necessary extension of time 1 May 2020, where you seek the following information:

1. Inventories of PPE (broken into pairs of gloves, masks, face screens and scrubs) held by your organisation on March 31, 2020.

NMH response

- (a) Pairs of gloves 310,750 pairs
- (b) Masks 679 boxes of 50
- (c) Face Shields 33 boxes of 25
- (d) Scrubs: NMH does not own hospital scrubs as we find it more advantageous to have laundered scrubs supplied to the DHB.
- 2. Typical monthly use rates for the above items for the 2019 calendar year

NMH response

This information is not available in a form that identifies monthly usage rates for PPE items. As such, NMH declines to respond for this aspect of your request under section 18(f) as *'the information requested cannot be made available without substantial collation and research'*.

3. Expected or modelled monthly surge demand for such items caused by the Covid-19 outbreak.

NMH response

This information is not available in a form that identifies expected or modelled monthly surge demand for PPE items. As such, NMH declines to respond for this aspect of your request under section 18(f) as 'the information requested cannot be made available without substantial collation and research'.
