## Response to a request for official information

Thank you for your request for official information received 9 July 2020 by Nelson Marlborough Health (NMH)<sup>1</sup>, where you seek the following information:

1. What percentage of your usual clinical workforce is overseas-trained? If possible, please provide percentages of overseas-trained staffers in each of these categories: doctors, nurses, midwives, and allied health, science and technical professionals

<u>NMH response</u>: Our electronic reporting system does not capture the location where employees gain qualifications, as a specific category.

2. What impact do you expect border restrictions to have on the DHB workforce over the next year?

<u>NMH response</u>: In reference to the accepted definition of official information 'held', agencies are required to provide a fact-based response. There is no obligation to form an opinion or make an assumption and, as such, NMH is unable to respond under section 12(2) 'the official information requested shall be specified with due particularity in the request'.

3. Are there specialities likely to be under pressure as a result of border restrictions? For example, because there is a small workforce in New Zealand or because of overseas training needs.

NMH response: The majority of our Senior Medical Officer positions are recruited overseas.

4. Is your DHB currently recruiting for any clinical positions which you cannot fill with New Zealand applicants? If so, how many, and what is/are the positions?

<u>NMH response</u>: Yes. The DHB advertises specific positions in both New Zealand and overseas at the same time. The majority of our Senior Medical Officer positions, in particular Radiologists and Psychiatrists, are filled by overseas candidates.

5. Have you had any overseas-trained and recruited clinicians cut contracts short and return home because of COVID? If so, how many, and in what category (doctor, nurse ...)?


<u>NMH response</u>: We are not aware of any candidates recruited overseas terminating their contracts due to COVID-19.


## 6. Anything else you wish to add?
