Response to a request for official information

Dear

Thank you for your request for official information, as a partial transfer of Parts 1 and 2 (of 3) from the Ministry of Health and received 1 October 2020 by Nelson Marlborough Health (NMH)¹, followed by the necessary extension of time 30 October 2020 where you ask:

1. What was the percentage of workers across the whole of the DHB's who had received fit testing in the previous twelve months?

<u>NMH response</u>: 84% of DHB frontline workers in designated high-risk areas, or situations where there is risk of exposure to diseases that are transmitted via an airborne route, have received respiratory fit testing during the previous 12 months.

Our Infection Prevention team has undertaken a risk management approach for workers in areas where N95 or similar respiratory protection is to be worn in line with Ministry of Health direction.

Workers assessed as requiring the use of N95 masks include nurses (including flight nurses), doctors, physiotherapists, technicians, and core midwives working in various areas and services; Emergency Department, Intensive Care Coronary Unit, Post Anaesthesia Care Unit, Operating Theatre, Medical Unit, In-Patient Unit, Assessment, Treatment & Rehabilitation, Paediatrics, Endoscopy, Physiotherapy, Occupational Health, Dialysis and Radiology.

The NMH fit testing programme includes fit testing appropriate health care workers at the employee orientation programme.

2. What are the actual numbers for each DHB?
