## Response to a request for official information

Thank you for your request for official information as transferred from the Ministry of Health and received 29 April 2022 by Nelson Marlborough Health (NMH)<sup>1</sup>, followed by the necessary extension of time 27 May 2022, where you seek the following information.

 "If the treatment of Remdesivir and ventilators has been or are being used as a treatment for covid patients in hospital?"

## NMH response:

Remdezivir is part of the treatment algorithm found on the NZ Ministry of Health website <a href="https://www.health.govt.nz/covid-19-novel-coronavirus/covid-19-information-health-professionals/covid-19-advice-all-health-professionals">https://www.health.govt.nz/covid-19-novel-coronavirus/covid-19-information-health-professionals</a>

Ventilation (i.e. placing a breathing tube and using a ventilator to support respiration) depends on how sick the patient is from a breathing point of view. Medicines to treat COVID-19, and the complications of that infection sit side by side with ventilation and help treat the underlying disease. Ventilation does not depend on whether a person has received remdezivir or not.
